Lake Atwood Disc Golf Course



The Lake Atwood Disc Golf Course originated in discussion at a young adults

workshop, that was part of the Kansas HomeTown Prosperity Initiative. Disc golf is widely popular with 20 to 40 year olds and the group thought it was something that would attract young people to the Community, be a popular recreational opportunity and bring people to town for tournaments. The best place for a course was unanimously chosen to be the Lake Atwood Park. An informal steering committee was formed and permission was given by the Lake Township Board to Construct the Course.

Course design was done by Kjell Nordgren and LS Discs. Rawlins County FFA students constructed holes 1-9 in the Fall of 2010. and holes 10-18 in the Spring of 2011.

What is Disc Golf?

Disc golf, formalized in the 1970's, is played just like ball golf, except that players use a flying disc instead of balls and clubs. There are professionally designed discs for different shots, or you can simply play a round with a plastic disc. The object of the game is to complete each hole in the fewest number of throws. Each throw must be made from a spot where the previous throw landed. Once the disc is resting in the chains or in the basket, the hole is completed and the score can be recorded.

Rules for Recreational Play on this Course.

GENERAL RULES: Disc golf is played like golf. The object is to acquire the lowest completion score. Please pick up any trash you find and **stay out of the Lake at all times.** Throw safely and have fun!

TEE THROWS: Tee throws must be completed in the designated area on concrete pads. Do not throw until players ahead of your group are out of range.

LIE: The spot where the previous throw has landed is the placement for your next shot. Use a "mini" or turn over your disc to mark the spot.

THROWING ORDER: After teeing off, the player who is the farthest from the hole always throws first. The player who won the last hole goes first.

FAIRWAY THROWS: Fairway throws must be made with the foot closest to the hole on the lie. Run-ups and a follow-through step are allowed during a throw.

COMPLETION OF A HOLE: A hole is completed when a disc is at rest inside the basket or chains.

UN-PLAYABLE LIE: A disc that lies above ground must be played directly below the lie.

OUT OF BOUNDS: An out of bounds throw (in the lake, on Lake Rd or in parking lots, playgrounds or basketball courts) must be played 3 feet from where the throw went out of bounds.

PENALTIES: Recreational players will not incur penalties during play. Advanced players will take a one stroke penalty for out of bounds or water hazard throws. **DISCS THROW IN WATER REMAIN IN WATER!** On the two water holes please take alternate throw paths from walking path east of the Covered Bridge on #6 and on the Land Bridge on #18 if you can not make throw across water.
